When I was a young man, my family were famers and we farmed peanuts. The most impressive thing to me at harvest time was the thrasher. At that time I was impressed with how big the thrasher was and how many gears and operating pieces it had. Its purpose was to separate the peanuts from the vine. The peanuts would come out a spout for bagging and the vine would go out the back of the thrasher to be baled for hay. When all the pieces of the machine worked together, the goal was accomplished. But if one piece messed up because of the lack of maintenance, or breakage, things ended in a mess. When parts failed the hay would mix with the peanuts (not good). Sometimes the machine stopped completely (not good).

I have been preaching these many years and find that the church is similar to that harvest machine. When every person performs their duty, the church reaches the accomplished goal of our Savior. The word of God is spread. Souls are saved, and souls are edified. But, if just one person does not perform his duty the church is seriously hampered in its work. Sometimes the malfunction is so bad that the work practically stops.

Each of us has a responsibility in helping the church maintain the goal of Christ (I Corinthians 12:12-25). It is important that we keep ourselves well maintained and adjusted. May we never underestimate our value and importance. Let us never be a hindrance to the greatest work on earth. Let us be the part of the spiritual machine that functions well.

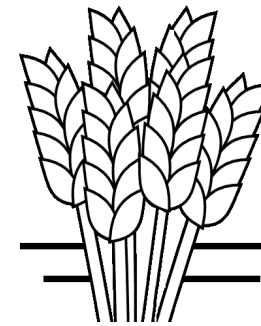
