FROM THE PREACHERS DESK

Hungry?

What is the hungriest you can ever remember being? When I was 17 years old, my best friend and I drove to Tahlequah, OK to float the Illinois River. When we arrived at the raft service, we were given three floating options of different lengths. We arrived early and it was the middle of summer, so we reasoned that we would do the longest float trip.

We ate breakfast before we started the trip, but we brought no food. About six hours into the trip we mentioned to one another that it would be nice to have a sandwich. Eight hours into the trip the word “starving” was used. Ten hours into the trip all we were talking about was what we were going to eat afterwards. Twelve hours into the trip there were no more words as we wearily and shakily drug our raft onto the shore and stumbled toward my pickup.

We ate at a place that no longer exists called “The Cookson Smokehouse.” We ordered a few appetizers, salads, giant steaks and BBQ ribs and, of course, blackberry cobbler a la mode. I don’t think I’ve ever eaten so much in one sitting in my life. When we left, we made it about five miles down the road before we had to stop on the side of the highway...I will spare you the rest.

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus tells us about a different kind of intense hunger – a hunger for righteousness. Matthew 5:6 says:

“Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.”

What is the most spiritually hungry you can remember being? It is more common to hear someone say, “So-in-so is really on fire for God,” instead of “So-in-so is really starving for God,” but the meaning is the same. The world, and even the church, has a way of throwing a bucket of water on our fire for God, a way of saying, “Hey, if you’re so hungry, eat this.” The fire that is burning bright within us is extinguished. The hunger that can only be satisfied by God is sated instead by the junk of this world.

My encouragement to you is this: GET HUNGRY AND STAY HUN-

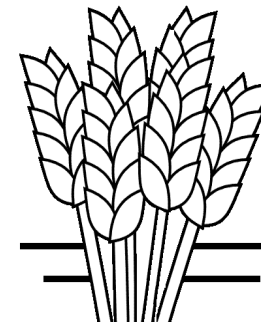
