If we want to understand love, we must first strive to understand God. The same goes for peace. Jesus came so that mankind could have peace in this life. You might say, "Wes, you are dreaming. In today's text, the word *sons* comes from the Greek word *huios* and means, "offspring." In the English translation from the Greek, *huios* is translated 85 times as son and 49 times as children. The general definition is "the offspring of men." The most appropriate rendering of Matthew 5:9 is this: "*Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God.*"


THE CHRISTIAN'S ATTITUDE TOWARD CHRISTMAS
