The Light of the World

Are you afraid of the dark? I fight against the fear of darkness with all of the manliness that I can muster but if I am honest, I have to admit that I am still afraid of the dark. There's just something about it that speaks of a dreadful unknown.

I feel foolish when I turn on the light but I feel a bit frightened when I don't.

It shouldn't surprise me that I feel uneasy in the dark, after all, the Bible often uses darkness to represent evil and light to represent what is good. God knew we would easily make that connection. John refers to Jesus as light. John 1:1-5

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. <sup>2</sup> He was in the beginning with God. <sup>3</sup> All things came into being through Him, and apart from Him nothing came into being that has come into being. <sup>4</sup> In Him was life, and the life was the Light of men. <sup>5</sup> The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it.

From the time of the fall of mankind in the garden, the world knew no true light, no true good until Jesus was born. Wise men and shepherds followed a light in the night sky that led them to the true light, Jesus.

In our text today, Jesus is going to tell you and I that we are the lights of the world. Is this how you think of yourself, as a light in a dark world? Think about what that implies. Isn't it amazing that Jesus puts His light into His followers so that we can be His lights to the world?
