**DON'T WORRY BUT PRAY**  
We are a society who worries more and prays less. We are full of anxiety and fret over many things. We struggle to distinguish the difference between legitimate concern and unnecessary worry. If we do not have something to agonize about, we manufacture a problem. We imagine troubles that are possible. We are like the disgruntled farmer who complained to his neighbor saying, “Your miserable rooster keeps me up all night.” The neighbor replied, “I don't understand. He hardly ever crows. But if he does, it's never more than two or three times.” “That isn't my problem,” the farmer shot back. “What keeps me awake is not knowing when he might crow.”  
We often are distressed about difficulties that could arise. The Lord clearly tells us how to deal with such uneasiness-Pray! “Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer...let your request be made known to God” (Philippians 4:6). Instead of worrying about everything, unload your heavy burden unto God so that peace might be yours. One church had a sign in front of it which read, “Turn Care Into Prayer.” The Lord urges us to cast “all your care upon Him, for he cares for you” (1 Peter 5:7). The almighty is in control and He knows what He is doing. Why not trust Him? What will our prayers do? They will drive out worry and fill us with a tranquil spirit as we understand that our problems are in the Lord's hands (Philippians 4:7). 
