Doing Something

Curtis Lemay, the famous Air Force general of World War II and later Chief of Staff of the United States Air Force, once said,

"I'd rather have someone who was real stupid but did something then have someone who would vacillate and do nothing."

Just for the record, General Lemay did not want to be surrounded by unintelligent leaders. The context behind his statement was a time in military history when there were constant arguments and disagreements about how to proceed with nothing actually getting accomplished. He was making a point, and his point was, DO SOME-THING!

Lemay was not a person who could tolerate inaction. He spoke very little, but did a lot. He was a man of action. He was a doer. That's why I use him as my example. I LOVE doers.

Ministry can feel a lot like the military. Our mission is important. Lives are at stake. But the question of how to do ministry effectively is under constant debate.

The debate is exhausting and sucks the life and enthusiasm out of the troops. So what's the solution? I don't know. If I knew, ministry would be easy. But here's an idea that I think is good.

Let's do more doing and less debating. You may feel like I'm picking on you. I'm not. I'm just speaking in general, I promise. But the reason why I fear that some would find this offensive is because I think we're all guilty from time to time.

We hear an idea and we immediately see all of the problems instead of the possibilities. And I know that there's some legitimacy there. Good ideas are not easy to come up with and they're even harder to implement.

For example, do you know how hard it was for the military to switch from horses to tanks? I'm not joking. Isn't that crazy? I mean, compare the use of a horse versus a tank! The tank won out eventually, but very begrudgingly, and only after the world witnessed Nazi Germany's offensive referred to in history as the "Blitzkrieg," meaning "Lightning War," which owed its success to the tank. I'm speaking solely from a philosophical position, but also as someone who doesn't want to vacillate forever, but to DO SOMETHING, and consider, Jesus had a revolutionary ministry. He was a doer, and He calls us to be doers too. "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men (Matthew 4:19)."

Let's follow Jesus and continue to do something, TOGETHER!


