FROM THE PREACHERS DESK
Never-Ending Service

As followers of Jesus, we are called to approach life like a long-distance runner approaches a race. But unlike a literal race, our race is not complete until we exhale our final breath and experience the last beat of our heart.

The unknown author of the Book of Hebrews gives us some advice to help us in our race in Hebrews 12:1-3 –

Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, ²fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. ³For consider Him who has endured such hostility by sinners against Himself, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

I don’t understand the full extent of the cloud of witnesses surrounding us, but the author imagined being watched by a heavenly host as he lived his life.

He goes on to say to lay aside every encumbrance and sin. This is a special distinction because he separates every encumbrance from sin. It’s obvious that we should stay away from sin, but there are many encumbrances in life that are not, in and of themselves, sinful. We’re advised to lay aside, or get rid of, anything that will entangle us. In other words, we’re told to not be distracted from our top priority of running our race and there are so many things in life that are not eternally worthwhile that can easily slow us down or stop us from fulfilling the service that God had called us into.

If you find yourself “never having time” to do service for God, you’ve likely weighed yourself down with the encumbrances of this life. It takes a conscience effort and most often a sacrifice of these encumbrances to follow Jesus.

How do I begin to make the necessary changes and sacrifices I
