FROM THE PREACHERS DESK

Help for the Helpless

Proverbs 21:13 says, He who shuts his ear to the cry of the poor will also cry himself and not be answered.

This is a very interesting proverb and deserves close investigation. First of all, upon examination of the words, there is one that is a bit problematic in its translation into English. That word is "poor."

We probably all have similar, but not quite the same ideas about what it means to be poor, but is our idea of poorness the same as the proverb writer?

Upon closer examination, the word that is translated into poor is *dal*, which comes from the root word *dālal*, which literally means "to hang" or "to be brought low." The word *dal* can mean poor in the sense of being without means, but a more general sense of the word would simply mean a person with a need they are unable to fulfill. Such a person is *dālal* or has their head hanging in sorrow because they need something they don't have. They have been brought low, or humbled, by their need.

An alternative translation of the same verse could read, *He who shuts* his ear to the cry of the <u>one in need</u> will also cry himself and not be answered.

I say all of that to say that it's not necessarily a financial need that is being referred to here. So what wisdom can we glean? Because God is so gracious to us, it is a minimum expectation of His that we be gracious to others. Another verse that gets at the heart of this proverb is Galatians 6:9-10, which says,

⁹Let us not lose heart in doing good, for in due time we will reap if we do not grow weary. ¹⁰ So then, while we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, and especially to those who are of the household of the faith.

Some might question if these verses are teaching us to do good things for the wrong reasons. I may not want to help the person in need, but for fear that God won't help me, I do. Or from the Galatians passage - I may do good, not because I want to do good, but so that I might reap a reward by doing so. To think in this way is to miss the point.

The point in both is that God loves people. He's proved that to us by
